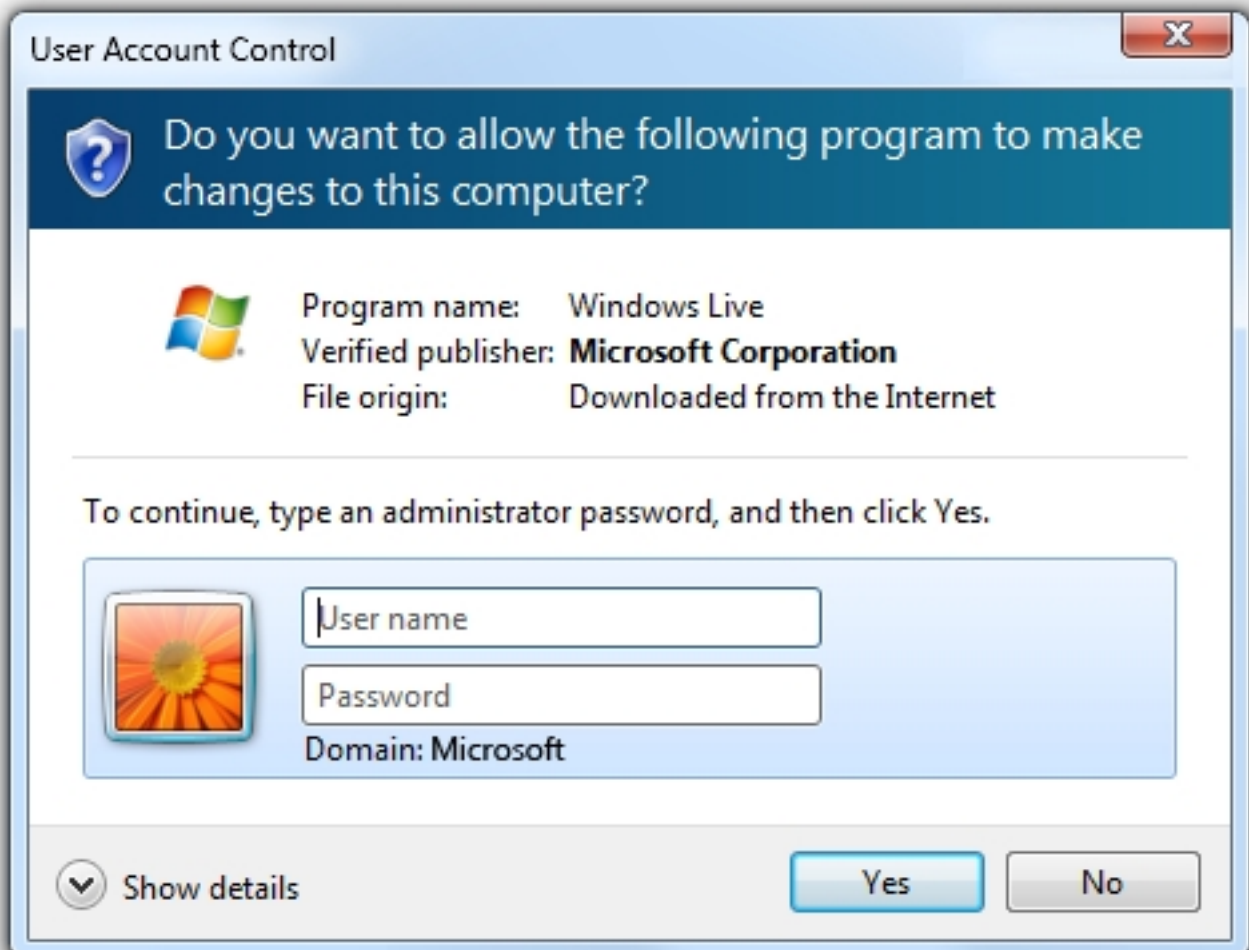


Tired wondering why the UAC (User Account Control) pops up when you start (for example) regedt32 (or regedit) as an user only to view in your registry?



Just a method for bypassing the UAC prompt for an application to start as a normal user on Windows 7. For example REGEDT32.exe (Regedit)

Import this registry file:

```
Windows Registry Editor Version 5.00
[HKEY_CURRENT_USERSoftwareMicrosoftWindows
NTCurrentVersionAppCompatFlagsLayers]
"C:\windows\system32\regedt32.exe"="RUNASINVOKER"
```

"C:\windows\regedit.exe"="RUNASINVOKER"

As an user you can import this file with the command prompt command:

```
reg import regfile.reg
```

To add applications to bypass the UAC prompt specify the whole path to the executable. This change is instant active and no reboot/logoff is required.
